Icy Hearts... by Judi Sweeney When I woke up at 6:30 am on Saturday, I got an unexpected surprise. As I walked out of our bedroom, I glanced out the first window I could look out. At this time of year, the entire window view is taken up with lilac branches. I could see it was raining, and the branches were obviously wet. I started to walk away, but something pulled me back. I think it was the drops on the bottom of the branches. I looked at them carefully. They were all about the same size, bigger than I would usually see. And the wet branches were actually a little shiny. I looked closer...ICE! The branches were covered with ice. I went over to the living room door. The driveway was wet also, but again, I looked more closely. It was ice, the kind of ice that people sometimes miss. Ice on surfaces can be so deceptive. It's just a thin, perfectly clear coat most of the time; but when you don't expect it, ice can have disastrous impacts.

In November of 2010, I had my left knee replaced. It was a difficult recovery, and I didn't like being stuck in the house one little bit. I went to PT. I did the exercises. I just wanted to go outside and walk. One very sunny day, after watching people out on the ice on the lake, I decided I wanted to take a walk on the ice. I figured I was safe. There was a little snow covering the ice, so I thought that would add traction. Out Jack and I went...and down I went. The ice under the snow was super slippery. I threw my arm out at the last minute to try to avoid hurting my new knee. Thankfully, the knee was fine. However, within days, my shoulder started aching, and it got worse. Several months later, I had another surgery for a torn rotator cuff in my shoulder. I had learned a lesson about ice. I learned how dangerous it could be.

Just seeing ice on branches wouldn't normally lead me to write about it in the meditation. but God then led me to an article with a verse from Luke 21. In verse 34, a The Passion Translation of the Bible reads, "Be careful that


in our relationship with Him. They also learned about this awesome phenomenon we call "God things" and to be grateful and in awe when God aligns things so beautifully in our lives.

you never allow your hearts to grow cold. Be careful that you are not caught off guard, or hearts will be weighed down with carousing, drunkenness, and the worries of this life, and that day will come upon you suddenly like a trap. Don't let me come and find you drunk or living carelessly like everyone else." This quote came from Jesus' talking to his disciples about the End Times. He had explained to them all the signs of the end times, and in this verse He warned them not to let their hearts grow cold. Immediately, cold hearts triggered the idea of icy hearts, hearts that are so weighed down with personal sin and the worries of life that even believers may not see the signs that Jesus is coming soon.

The image of icy hearts, of hearts grown cold, overwhelmed me. In Matthew 24:12, I read, *"And because lawlessness will be increased, the love of many will grow cold."* This was a teaching that Jesus gave His disciples right before the end of His life. Again, Jesus was trying to make them (and us) aware of the difficult times that would come and how that difficulty could make their love (or hearts) grow cold. Icy hearts spell trouble for everyone that they encounter. The story of Joseph and his brothers spells out how ugly people become when they let ice cover their hearts.

Icy Hearts and Blind Parents

Joseph was the second to youngest of 12 brothers. For years, the older brothers had grown jealous of Joseph because of the perceived favor their father showed toward Joseph. Year after year, the ice covered their hearts until that day when Joseph received the coat of many colors. In Genesis 37:4, we read, "But when his brothers saw that their father loved him more than all his brothers, they hated him and could not speak peacefully to him." Their icy hearts were now totally hard toward him, and it seems that their father didn't see what was happening. Like the clear ice covering the branches of my lilac bush, their cold and icy hearts were not even seen by Jacob. Joseph had dreams about the future that angered them even more as their icy hearts continued to harden against him. Yet, his father sent Joseph to join his brothers. Verse 18 tells us, "They saw him from afar, and before he came near to them they conspired against him to kill him." They didn't kill him (probably because Rueben, the eldest, didn't want to be held responsible), but the sons threw their brother into a cistern, dipped his robe in blood and carried that home to show their father. "Then Jacob tore his garments and put sackcloth on his loins and mourned for his son many days" (verse 34). They not only got rid of their brother, but they also were paid to do it by passing merchants who took Joseph into Egypt. Their icy hearts felt nothing.

The Road to an Icy Heart

Anyone can end up with an icy, hard heart. It may look the same on the surface; but the hard heart, the heart covered with ice, is not what God wants for any of us. The story of Joseph, his father Jacob and his brothers is full of selfishness, jealousy, anger, betrayal and bitterness on the part of his brothers. They did something to their father and to Joseph that I find hard to even imagine. Yet it happened, and neither Joseph nor his father Jacob saw it coming. They "missed" seeing the ice, and without God's intervention, it would have destroyed them all.

Melting an Icy, Hard Heart

We live with frozen hearts. Icy hearts need to be thawed out. In Psalm 147, the psalmist praises the Lord for His command over everything. He talks about God's command over the snow, frost and crystals of ice. Then in verse 18, he adds this, "He sends out His word and melts them." In that verse is the answer to melting an icy, hardened heart – the Word of God. With the Word of God, our heart becomes what God designed it to be – something soft enough to let the love of God to flow through us into the people around us. As we read in 1 John 4:7, *"Beloved, let us love one another, for love is from God, and whoever loves has been born of God and knows God."* The icy heart melts.

March Cabinet Report

by Nancy Bemis, Chairperson The Cabinet met on Thursday, March 14. Reports were received from the Treasurer, Pastor Joe and the following committees: Diaconate, Christian Education, Finance, Nominating, Property and Missions.

Celia Daniels, our Treasurer, reported that our February income was \$18,033.95 and our expenses were \$22,003.78.

Phil Ingersoll-Mahoney reported for the Finance Committee. He said that our projected income for the current fiscal year will be \$244,614. Our budgeted expenses are \$240,535. He presented a draft budget prepared by the Finance Committee for fiscal year 2024-2025 (July 1, 2024 – June 30, 2025). The largest increase requested in the budget is for Christian Education. Raises of 3% for employees is being proposed.


Karen Bessette attended the meeting to discuss the chicken barbecue on Memorial Day and the cost and funds needed for the event. She also asked to set the date for the Fall Fest. It will be held on September 28 with a rain date of October 5 and will last 3 hours.

Steve Ottman reported for the Property Committee. He said that the Fire Department has completed its annual inspection.

Crystal Caron discussed the VBS budget. There is not enough in the CE budget this year to cover the expenses for the program. Donations will be requested by providing envelopes in the pews specifically for VBS prior to the event and at the closing program. There will also be an online option to give.

Permission was given for a small library sponsored Easter egg hunt on the church lawn and for the library's May Festival on May 4 which has been held annually on the church lawn.

The next Cabinet meeting will be Thursday, April 11, at 6:30.
