# If you offer...

Monday morning I slept in until 7:10 am. I dragged myself out of bed, made coffee, went into the back room and greeted Jack, who was already awake. It took me a good half an hour to really wake up and come up with one of my least favorite daily questions to Jack, "What do you want for breakfast?" Now, you need to understand that Jack has particular tastes (and distastes), so there isn't a really long list from which he can choose. I tried to get by choices that would create a half hour's work (or more) in the kitchen by adding, "I'll make anything with the cinnamon bread we already have." Still no answer, but I knew he was thinking. I added (without thinking it through), "I can make toast, or French toast." The minute it was out of my mouth, I knew what he would choose - French toast. So, I dragged my tired self with an unhappy face out to the kitchen to make it. (Now he did offer to have toast as he saw me dragging myself to the kitchen.) I made the French toast, but I didn't make it with a very Christian attitude.

My parents always raised me with the idea that if you gave someone a set of options, and they chose one of the options you gave them, then you needed to give that option to them with joy - not sighing, not complaining, not dragging off to do it. One Mother's Day, I offered to do any chore my mother asked of me that day. The key word was "any." I didn't think about that, and my mother asked if I could clean the bathroom for her (she had run out of time the day before). Immediately, these words came out of my mouth, "I hate cleaning the bathroom!" My mother's quiet response was, "But you said you would do anything." That stopped any further discussion, but honestly it didn't affect my attitude. I pouted through the entire clean-up. Later, we talked about how important our attitude is when we offer to give something or do something for someone else and they take us up on our offer.

Missions Update

#### SEND International

John and Susan Edwards of SEND International have been missionaries to Japan for over 30 years. They are some of the most recent additions to our missions' support. (Our church funds missions through donations specified for missions. The money going to these missions does not come from the church budget.) "Our regular gatherings at Hikari House (our house) have been wonderful for deepening relationships. For several months now during our Wednesday morning Tea Time, Susan chooses a scene from "The Chosen" and prints out the corresponding Bible passage in English and Japanese. We watch the video clip, read the scripture, and discuss Jesus. In March, we watched a clip from the old "Jesus" video of Jesus' death and resurrection. Two of our guests, both adult women, had never heard this story before. One has commented that the video clips have helped her to understand the Bible better. One local believer often prepares a song to sing. One simple Japanese song about how wonderful Jesus is was written by a sickly eight-year-old child. Our guests were moved by this child's faith."

The day before Easter, we planned an outreach event for children at our church in neighboring Murayama city. (There is only one child who semi-regularly attends our church.) Nineteen children came. Two middle school students left early but the rest stayed. They played games, got some snacks, and they heard the story of Jesus' death and resurrection expertly told by two members of the church. Many of the children and even a couple mothers had never heard about this before."






# Meeting Dates Vacation Bible School for Helpers and Teachers

#### Attitude Adjustment

The first obvious place to go in the Bible to study this idea is in 2 Corinthians 9:7, "God loves a cheerful giver." Obviously, I didn't do that this morning. I wasn't cheerful when Jack chose exactly what I had offered. Looking at the context of that verse shows that Paul actually understood this, "The point is this: whoever sows sparingly will also reap sparingly, and whoever sows bountifully will also reap bountifully. Each one must give as he has decided in his heart, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver. And God is able to make all grace abound to you, so that having all sufficiency in all things at all times, you may abound in every good work." If we actually offer a series of things to someone else that we have decided in our hearts, then we should do what they decide on from our list of offers. But we can't do this reluctantly or under compulsion. We should do it with joy, with a cheerful heart. When we act in this way, God gives us "all grace" to complete the task, even if it is hard for us.

But where do we go from here? Do we never offer to help out a person if that offer would cause us distress, time, effort, money, etc.? What if it was the Holy Spirit who sent a "niggle" of a suggestion to your heart and mind, an idea that said, "Offer your time to help that person."? What if you have to give up something that you have in order to lovingly meet the needs of others? Paul, in Philippians 2:14-16 offers us part of the answer, "Do all things without grumbling or disputing, that

you may be blameless and innocent, children of God without blemish in the midst of a crooked and twisted generation, among whom you shine as lights in the world, holding fast to the word of life, so that in the day of Christ I may be proud that I did not run in vain or labor in vain." We are to be a shining light to the world, an example. Our grumbling and complaining ruins the light of the Church to the rest of the world. Isn't it twice as bad because we actually offered to do something in the beginning, but now we complain about what it "cost" us?

With Mother's Day coming this weekend, I can't help but wonder how much better my mother would have felt if I had cleaned the bathroom with a smile. I recently read a quote that made me remember all of this lesson, "When you start thinking about reasons to complain, think instead of someone you can bless." And if that doesn't sink in completely, consider this – Jesus offered to die for us so that we would not be eternally punished for our sins. He didn't complain. He didn't roll his eyes. He didn't fight back or even state His case to those who hated Him. Many, many years before, Isaiah accurately prophesied how Jesus would handle His own death and the salvation He had offered each of us in Isaiah 53:7, "He was oppressed, and he was afflicted, yet he opened not his mouth; like a lamb that is led to the slaughter, and like a sheep that before its shearers is silent, so he opened not his mouth." No matter what He had to go through, no matter the pain, He joyously gave of Himself...for us. That must be our model for giving to others.
